### **Executive summary**

The report 3 Baltic University Library Meeting (15-16 May, 2019) at the Library of the University of Latvia (UL) to present the newest branch library of UL – The Library of the House of Science. The House of Science is the second bilding in the Campus of UL after the House the Nature. The House of Science contains all fields of exact, medical and life sciences thus ensuring efficient use of both infrastructure and human resources and promoting synergies between the studies and research.



The House of Science



Construction was started in August 2017, completed in January 2019 (18 months). Total construction and equipment costs of the building, including purchase of equipment and equipment for scientific and research purposes -36 million EUR.

Some facts: total area of the building: 20 018  $m^2$  and eight overground floors and one underground floor.

The House of Science has eight UL departments:

- two Faculties: Faculty of Medicine, Faculty of Physics, Mathematics and Optometry,
- six Institutes: Institute of Cardiology and Regenerative Medicine, Institute of Physics, Institute of Geography and Geoinformatics, Institute of Atomic physics and Spectroscopy, Institute of Material Mechanics, Astronomy Institute.



The building can accommodate:

- up to 2 000 students (around 1 400 students daily are planned),
- 450 work places for scientific and academic staff,
- 15 auditoria (large auditorium with 386 seats, ix medium auditoria with 60-70 seats, eight small auditoria with a number of seats below 50),
- eight workshop rooms (10-20 seats each),
- 78 scientific and study laboratories,
- two computer classes with 48 work space.

Library of the House of Science: are to located on the 2nd floor of the building; has many study places for students and group work. The new library is already the second UL's library which is **open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week**.



There are 18 000 copies of the most popular and up-to-date publications in physics, mathematics and medical sciences and over 170 000 electronic resources. Books can be taken home, returned or the booking can be extended at any time through two self-service machines (the latest models).




The uniqueness of the library is a **self-service computer wall with 36 portable computers**, the first service of this kind in Baltic. The service is offered to university students and staff. The service offered by the new library have already received positive feedback and popularity.

- There are plenty of places to work in the library.

As librarians, the goal is to support and promote student success while providing optimal physical and virtual environments catering to today's 24/7 culture.

The next house of the campus of UL will be House of Letters.



The opening of the House of Letters is expected in 2023, and this third building of Academic Centre will accommodate. House of Letters will provide study space for 11 000 students and 1 100 staff members.
